

Bay County will hold a public hearing for the Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study for the third phase of the Philip Griffitts Sr. Parkway from Clara Avenue to Chip Seal Parkway. The intent of this hearing is to provide results of the PD&E Study and provide an opportunity for interested persons to share their perspectives on proposed improvements. Project displays and documents will be available to view at the hearing, or by visiting www.philipgriffittsparkway.com. Project study reports will also be available for review beginning Thursday, October 16, 2025 through Thursday, November 20, 2025 at the Panama City Beach Library located at 12500 Hutchison Boulevard in Panama City Beach, Monday through Wednesday from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m., Thursday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., and Saturday from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Bay County representatives and project team members will be available at the hearing to explain proposed improvements, answer questions, and receive comments. The hearing will begin with an informal open house from 5:30 p.m. to 6 p.m., followed by a formal presentation and a public comment period.




hat Are the Project Goals? The new Philip Griffitts Sr. Parkway Phase III is intended to improve regional connectivity in the area, thereby relieving some of the congestion on U.S. 98 (Panama City Beach Parkway) and improving safety outcomes in the area. The PD&E Study was conducted to identify and assess impacts of the new roadway corridor connecting Clara Avenue to Chip Seal Parkway on the social, economic, cultural, natural, and physical environments in this area of Bay County. Preliminary design activities have been completed concurrently with the PD&E Study to more efficiently move the project forward toward construction.



roposed Improvements: Bay County has evaluated the proposed extension of Philip Griffitts Sr. Parkway Phase III, from Clara Avenue to Chip Seal Parkway. Project alternatives were presented to the public for review and feedback during the Public Alternatives Meeting on March 6, 2025. Based on community input and the results of the environmental and engineering analyses, Bay County is recommending advancement of the preferred alternative with preliminary design. The proposed typical sections, which provide visual representations of the roadway configuration, are shown below.

What Can You Anticipate? The PD&E Study is anticipated to be completed in early 2026. Design and permitting for the project will continue through 2026. Right-of-way and construction will follow, if funding is identified.

Bay County will consider and respond to each comment, with completion of the PD&E Study anticipated by early 2026. All comments provided, or postmarked, on or before Thursday, November 20, 2025, will become part of the official record.
